

The 2014 CSI program has turned out to be very different than we initially expected. The idea to follow with a similar program to last year was modified by some unique opportunities to train the next generation of JAC youth in Juvenile Justice and Mental Health ideals.

The youth completed a 2 day training to gain certification in Youth Mental Health First Aid covering topics that included a five step action plan for how to help young people both in crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics included anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which Psychosis might occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including AD/HD), and eating disorders.

This knowledge was put to use in the community as we collaborated with other agencies annual events.

If that was not enough, we then assisted in the Juvenile Justice Learning Series: Why aren't YOU helping me bringing icebreakers, leadership building exercises, role playing and interactive hands-on learning opportunities to professionals in the Mental Health and Juvenile Justice systems in Wayne County.

There were many roses among the thorns, many lessons learned, and opportunities to discover inner strength. Were proud to introduce to the community well trained, competent and certified young leaders for the next generation.




